Julie's Memory Joggers Traer Oct. 4, 1945

This town was greatly shocked and grieved Wednesday afternoon when they received word that Gus Silvers and Tom Cox had been killed at the railroad crossing on the county line west of town. They had gone to look at a building at the H.F. Berndt farm, and were returning home when the eastbound freight struck their car and carried it 600 feet before it stopped. A double funeral was held Sunday afternoon at the Methodist church for R.A. Silvers and Tom Cox. The services were conducted by Rev. Howard Smothers, pastor of the Methodist Church at Oberlin, and Rev. Vernon Lemon, pastor of the Pentecostal Church at Traer. Mrs. H.L. Phillips and daughters arrived Saturday morning from New York for the funeral of their father, R.A. Silvers.

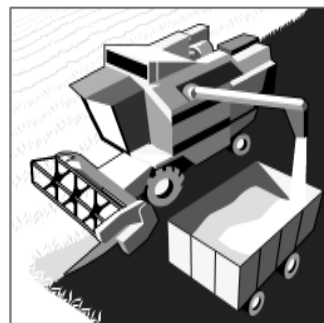

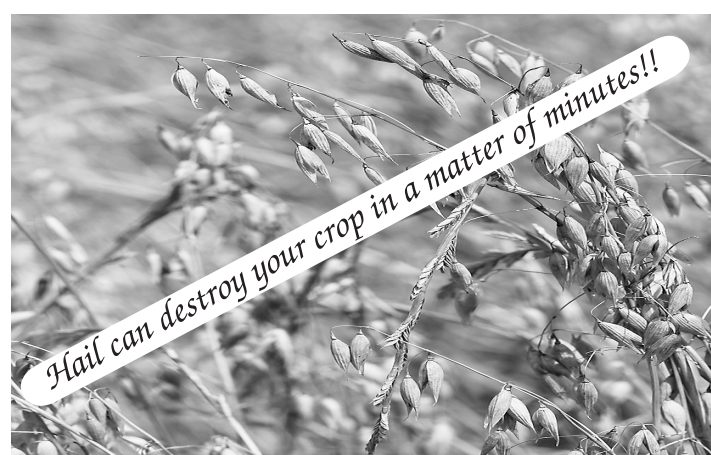
