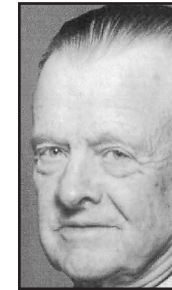
He was preceded in death by his parents, a sister and a brother.
