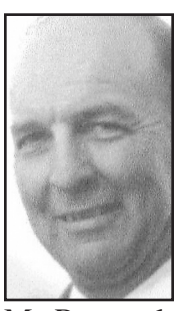
A story in the Oct. 24 edition of *The Oberlin Herald* said that the Decatur Community High football team could not go to a post-season game because the team had lost two district contests.

The Red Devils won by 43 points and the Plainsmen downed the Railroaders, so Oberlin is on its way to the first round of the playoffs.
