Farmers that have not signed contracts have until June 1

Farmers who have not yet signed up for the United States Department of Agriculture Farm Service Agency's 2005 Direct and Counter-cyclical Program are running out of time, according to Farm Service Agency County Executive Director Angie Berens. The deadline to submit a signed contract with out incurring a late fee is June 1.

"About 85 percent of our producers have signed their 2005 contracts," Mrs. Berens, said. "We are concentrating on getting that last 15 percent into the office before the June 1 cut off." Producers submitting contracts after that will be assessed a late filing fee of \$100 per farm.

There is more to it than just saving the late filing fees. When producers sign their contracts, they have the option of selecting whether and when to receive the direct and counter-cyclical payments offered by the program.

Under the Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP), all producers receive a direct payment based on their historic crop acreage base and yield for eligible commodities. Producers can elect to receive their direct payments in two

installments when they sign their contracts.

Direct and County-cyclical Program's counter-cyclical payments are made for a commodity only when the commodity's effective price is below its target price, which is set by law.

Completing the contract paperwork is not complicated according to Mrs. Berens. However, depending upon the size and complexity of the farm, the process can be time consuming.

"If producers who haven't signed their 2005 contracts will call the county office staff and set up appointments, we can avoid the late fees and the last minute rush," Mrs. Berens said.

The final hurdle in the process is getting all of the required signatures on the contract. All producers, including owners and operators, who will share in the contract payments on the farm must sign the contract before the county committee can approve the contract for payments.




