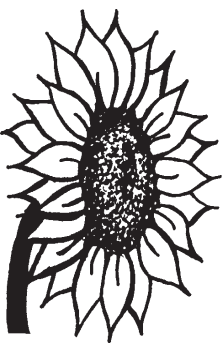

### Sainty works hard at meet

Athletes from 11 area high schools participated in the Dundy County Invitational on Tuesday, April 4.

The Indians and Lady Indians from St. Francis finished the day with a number of tracksters placing in the top six positions, earning points for the team.

With a total of 94 points, the Sainty Ladies placed second for the day. The first place team was Medicine Valley with 101 points.

The Sainty boys earned 57 points for a sixth place finish. Cambridge with 90 points earned the first place trophy.

Individual first place winners for St. Francis were Talisa Voorhies in the long jump (16-03.5) and the triple jump (33-00.5) and Ally Reichert in the shot put (36-06.1).

The girls 4x800-meter relay team placed first with a time of 10:41.6. Members of the team are McKenzie Grace, Lauren Ross, Elizabeth Gienger and Melissa Burton.

Also placing first was the boys 4x100-meter relay team with a time of 46:50. Running were Joel McAtee, Ted Crabtree, Trevor Richard and Levi Weeden.

Bad weather canceled the Hoxie Invitational, which was to take place on Friday.

### Eighth grade boys place third at Burlington Invitational

The junior high track season opened for St. Francis in Burlington on Tuesday, April 4, with many athletes from the area involved in the competition.

"We had a good day with some good performances for our first track meet," said Ted Busse, head coach.

"I felt like the seventh and eighth grade girls competed super for their first meet," Coach Teri Orth said. "We had one new school record set by Lexee Reichert in the shot put. She had a throw of 34-4. The old record was held by Sidnee Crabtree with a throw of 31-3.75."

Athletes involved in the Invitational came from Colorado schools (Burlington, Stratton, Idalia, Kit Carson, Hi-Plains, Wray, Cheyenne Wells and Liberty) and from Kansas school (Sharon Springs, Goodland and St. Francis).

The day saw the Sainty seventh grade girls place third in the competition with a total of 50 points, while the eighth grade boys came in fourth with 60 points. The seventh grade boys collected 39 points for seventh place and the eighth grade girls 27 points for eighth place.

Indian athletes who earned first place medals in individual events during the day included Reichert in the seventh grade girls shot put and discus and Trent Raile in the eighth grade boys long jump and 100-meter dash

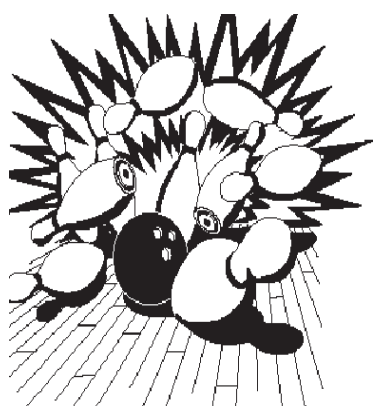

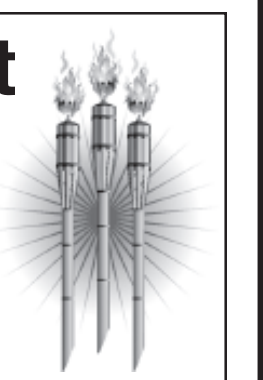

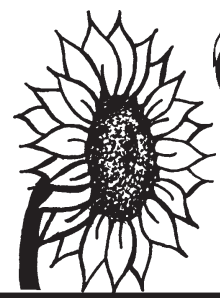
