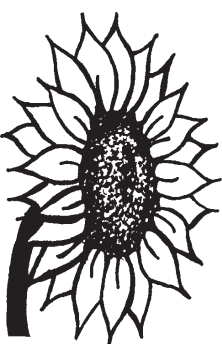

Kansas Wesleyan University

Kansas Wesleyan University Ladies track team attended the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference championship meet held at Bethany College in Lindsborg on May 5-6.

The Kansas Wesleyan women's team, which includes Amy Grace of St. Francis, finished the meet in seventh place.

Grace placed in the following events:

400-meter hurdles: placed fourth

with a time of 1:11.14 (Named honorable mention All-Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference)

Several school athletes provided strong competition at the Oberlin Invitational track meet held on Tuesday, May 2.

In the girls division, Oberlin collected 116 2/3 points to win the crown at their own meet. The St. Francis Ladies earned 61 points for fifth place.

Senior Talisa Voorhies paced the Sainty Ladies with a win in both the long jump (15-11) and the triple jump (34-1). She also added team points in the 100-meter dash and the 200-meter dash. Ally Reichert and Lauren Ross also accounted for several points for the team.

The 4x800-meter relay team from St. Francis was a first place winner with a time of 10:26.33. Team members besides Ross included McKenzie Grace, Elizabeth

both Gienger and Melissa Burton.

The Indians finished in the fifth position with a total of 66 points. Leading the pack in the boys division was Norton with 109 points.

In this division Mac Frewen stepped up and won the high jump with a leap of 5-8. Others earning team points were Joel McAtee, Ted Crabtree, Levi Weeden, Dylan Loyd, Matt Brown, Jordan Gienger and Trevor Richard. Crabtree, McAtee and Weeden each placed in two individual events while Richard placed in an individual event and ran a leg in two relays.
