## HEART IMPLANT LEAD DEFECTS

On October 14, 2007, Medtronic announced a defect in the electrical "lead" wire of its heart defibrillator and recalled the product. Affected models of the Sprint Fidelis defibrillator leads are 6930, 6931, 6948 and 6949. A fracture in the lead wire can lead to unnecessary, painful shocks to patients and may require replacement surgery. At least five deaths have been reported in patients with the defective leads.

# Woman receives recognition as a farm homemaker

Lois Lippert was recognized as a Colorado Master Farm Homemaker at the annual awards luncheon in Colorado Springs on Oct. 13. She was one of five women receiving recognition for community service and leadership, family involvement and support of production agriculture. Idalia Bicentennial Family Community Education Club nominated her for the award.

Born in Cheyenne County, Lois has never strayed far from her roots. In 1955, she married Wilhelm Lippert; they moved to their present location near Idalia in 1959. Like most farmers of that era, they milked cows and sold cream. They also grew market hogs, and Lois had a large flock of chickens. She still has some laying hens and enjoys chicken collectibles.

Today's primary crops are irrigated corn, pinto beans and dryland wheat. The Lippert's son Bob has assumed most of the farming responsibilities, but Lois drives the grain cart for both wheat and corn harvest and pinches where needed during the busy farming season.

The Lipperts have two daughters. Nancy works for the United States Embassy and is currently in Minsk, Belarus, formerly part of the Soviet Union. Daughter Susan, her husband, Alan, and their two teen agers make their home in Aurora.

Lois' faith and membership in Salem Lutheran Church is a hallmark of her life. She has served the church in many capacities, participating in its organizations, singing in the choir and attend-

ing regularly. Lois is on the Altar Committee and is a knowledgeable force behind the church's Sewing Committee which pieces quilts and lap robes for charitable needs.

Lois is one of those persons a community can always count on when help is needed. She has worked behind the scenes serving meals and assisting at fundraisers for everything from 4-H to Family Community Education Club. On behalf of others, she has stitched many a seam, and furnished many tasty treats from her kitchen...perhaps the most famous being the tiny, spicy Pepper Nuts, a traditional German cookie, she bakes in huge quantities every Christmas.

She supports the Yuma County Fair both as an exhibitor and a worker. A charter member of the Idalia Bicentennial Family Community Education Club, she has held office on the local and county level. ## Beware of current telemarket scam

Telephone rates appear to be higher before the break up of Ma Bell, but at least people know who their long distance carrier was.

Today, fierce competition among long distance carriers such as AT&T, MCI, Sprint and a couple hundred smaller companies has led to beyond shady practices to attract new customers.

It has become so outrageous that some customers have been surprised when opening their monthly phone bills to find that they have been switched to another long distance carrier. This bizarre phenomenon is known as "slamming."

Slamming is against the law. Federal law prohibits a company from

switching the long distance carrier without consent, in written or oral form, so many companies have stooped to a new, obscure method to get customers to sign up.

Customers should watch for the following:

- The check in the mail. If the customer gets a check from a long distance telephone carrier, it may

look as though no strings are attached. But, the customer should not cash it unless they want to be switched.

- The fine print. Some offers for magazine subscriptions or free samples now contain a fine-print statement obligating you to switch to a different phone company if the customer returns the offer.
